### **Chris Coleman**

Endorsed Randy Kelly for Mayor in 2001.

Voted to waive the living wage policy so that Marshall Field's could receive a \$7.2 million cash subsidy to downsize its St. Paul store.

Campaigned with Norm Coleman for the 1999 stadium tax referendum.

Voted with Randy Kelly to spend \$1 million of scarce city funds on a floodwall around MAC's downtown airport, creating the potential for expansion and increased noise.

### **Elizabeth Dickinson**

Spearheaded the successful grassroots effort to clean up three coalburning metro power plants, including the St. Paul High Bridge plant.

Campaigned to improve city energy policies and to promote a living wage for workers.

Secured immigrants' rights by advocating for an ordinance that protects St. Paul's community policing efforts from federal oversight (Police/INS Separation Ordinance).

Walks her talk: belongs to 3 unions, drives a hybrid car, serves on neighborhood committees, participates in community gardens, and is a model for grassroots civic engagement.

### **Randy Kelly**

Endorsed George W. Bush for President in 2004.

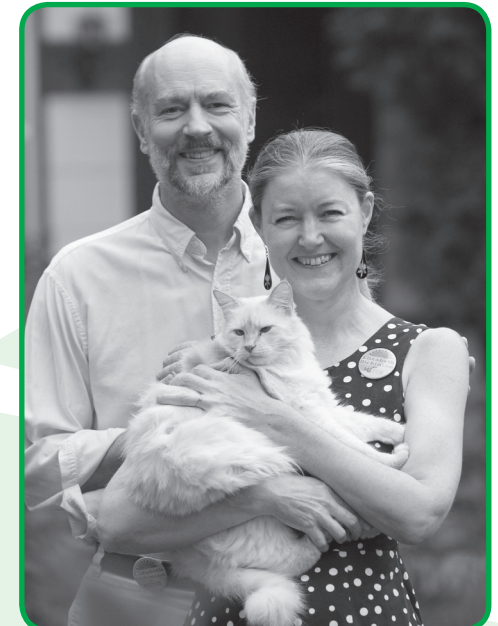
Proposed a 2006 budget that raids \$3.3 million from city departmental rainy day funds to pay for ongoing city services – setting up St Paul for operating shortfalls in 2007.

Opened Ayd Mill Road to heavy traffic and launched planning for a 4-lane freeway through adjacent residential neighborhoods.
